We are very happy to welcome you into the Master's Program in Colonial and Postcolonial Studies at Linnaeus University, Växjö, Sweden this fall 2024. We look forward to getting to know you and meet in courses and seminars.

There are a few things you need to do before you begin.

Obtaining a student account and register for the programme

You need a student account to be able to register for the programme in Ladok, a national system for student records, please get the account as soon as you can. Find information on how to do it here: [Lnu.se/en/student/new-student](https://www.lnu.se/en/student/new-student). Registration opens one week before the autumn semester, which begins on 2 September. Registration is open from 26 August. Students who are not participating actively in the programme during the first two weeks will be deregistered.

If you are not planning to study at Linnaeus University this autumn, please make sure to decline your place via www.universityadmissions.se or notify Helena Rydén (helena.ryden@lnu.se) as soon as possible. We can then remove you from the list and offer your place to someone else!

MyMoodle – the digital learning platform – opens mid August

When you are registered, you will be able to access our online learning platform MyMoodle. You will reach the pages relevant to you when you login with your student account. These are the same details as when you login at Lnu.se/Student.

It is very important that you get acquainted with the learning platform. Here is where you find all information about the programme and the courses, including syllabi and schedules. Please keep an eye on MyMoodle. If you have any questions about it, do not hesitate to ask.
