Examination (Seminars)

The examination shall consist of a written seminar paper (3,000 - 3,500 words, A-4 size) by an individual.

The length of the seminar paper, written by more than one individual (two students) 7,000-7,500 words and (three students) 10,000-10,500 words.

Oral presentation of seminar paper and participation in seminars is required and is compulsory, including opposing the seminar paper of one of your classmates. "Who oppose whom" shall be decided by the teachers.

You can choose the topic of seminar paper of your own choice in the field of Sustainable Development Law– confirmed by your teacher.

Seminar papers shall be in English.

Seminar paper's structure

- 1- Title of seminar paper (your name and person number)
- 2- Contents
- 3- Problem formulation
- 4- Purpose and hypothetical questions
- 5- Method (qualitative or quantitative) (Interview, observation (i.e making film), case study, collecting information through questionnaire and text analysis etc.)
- 6- Main part of you arguments, critics, comparison and analysis.
- 7- Summary
- 8- Write in your own words, but with references to literature and lectures. If you use *citations, make that explicit* with a proper reference including the page you are citing.

(In accordance with the university's policy all seminar papers will be checked through Genuine Text).

Opposing the seminar

- 1- The opponent shall present the opposing paper, positive and missing aspects of the seminar paper and analysis.
- 2- Response seminar paper writer
- 3- General discussion
- 4- Comments from the examinator
- 5- Opposing the paper is part of the exam.

Last date to submit the seminar paper is 10th August 2014. All seminar papers shall be available on the homepage (MOODLE) of this course.
