How to prepare for the studies and the first courses

To prepare for the upcoming autumn semester, please make sure to consult Digital Humanities Programme's Moodle. Moodle rooms for your first two courses – *Introduction to Digital Humanities* (4DH400) and *Digital Humanities Research Methods* (4DH410) – will be open in early August.

To aid some of you in developing your basic computer literacy, we have recorded [a series of short videos](#)⁸ with your instructors offering a casual introduction to working with computers.

Johanna Drucker's *The Digital Humanities Coursebook* (2021 or 2025 editions) offers a good introduction to the field and will be assigned reading in several courses. You will find the book available through the [university library](#)⁹ if you log in using your student credentials.

Lastly, you will find many digital humanities educational platforms available on the web to prepare you for your journey, such as [#dariahTeach](#), [DARIAH-Campus](#), or [Programming Historian](#). Please note that we only expect a basic familiarity with computers at the start of the programme.

Orientation meeting

We will hold a live online information meeting on **August 31st 10:00-11:00 (Central European Time/Swedish time)**. *Please save the date!* This meeting will provide you with information about the programme as well as give you the opportunity to meet your teachers and ask any questions you might have about your future studies.
