Advice from students:

- Don't overuse late-submission extensions
- Explore and play: DH is a big world, and depending on your background you need to explore and find the niche that works for you
- T-shaped scholarship: broad coverage, specific specialization
- Failing forward
- Be social (distance learning isolating)
